TOYOTA MOTOR MANUFACTURING VISITORS CENTER // BLUE SPRINGS, MS


This 15,000 sf project is located on a 6 acre site immediately adjacent to Toyota's existing Blue Springs, MS manufacturing plant. This cutting edge facility will serve both as a welcome center for visitors touring the plant and a training facility for Toyota employees. The project is designed to LEED Platinum standards, including over 6,000 sf of photovoltaic solar panels and a rainwater harvesting/reclamation system. Completion is scheduled for February 2020.

Bolden Elementary – Middle School MCAS Beaufort, SC

This project includes the construction of a 104,227 sf elementary-middle school (grades 3-8) featuring a two-story structure with standing seam metal roof, specialized geothermal mechanical system, electrical, plumbing and telecommunication systems. Site amenities include playgrounds, athletic facilities, sports fields, roadways, car and bus parking. Work also included the demolition of two schools and miscellaneous support structures. USGBC LEED requirements for this project will achieve a SILVER certification.

On Friday, May 24, Roy Anderson Corp and its subcontractors celebrated the placement of the highest elevation at the Mississippi Aquarium otherwise known as 'Topping Out'. Lunch was served, door prizes were won, t-shirts were distributed and baby alligators and a snake were held.







WINDOWS TO THE WATERS INSTALLED

Coordinating the lifting and placing a 40-ton acrylic panel is no easy task. It's a slow and meticulous process. Over a period of two weeks, Roy Anderson Corp did just that and then some. In March 2019, all the aquariums acrylic panels or 'windows to the waters' were transported to the jobsite located on Beach Blvd. in Gulfport. A 500-ton crane was used to lift and place these delicate panels.

The panels varied from a large viewing window in the main habitat (32' x 25 'x 16 inches thick and weighing more than 40 tons) to the 360 degree walking tunnel (30 'long x 9' in diameter and weighing more than 13.5 tons). The cylindrical acrylic window will be part of the swirl tank where visitors will be surrounded by sea life as the go up and down spiraling steps.

Once complete the Aquarium will contain ONE MILLION GALLONS of both salt and fresh water with more than 80,000 sf of exhibits connected by landscaped walkways. The Aquarium will also feature an interactive bird aviary where visitors will be able to get up close with a variety of colorful and beautiful exotic birds from around the world.




